Big Ben

This is the clock tower of the Palace of Westminster, built in 1859 by Charles Barry.



Cotswold District

It is famous for its picturesque beech forests, small villages with old stone houses and pastures.



Tower Bridge

One of the main symbols of London with beautiful bridge towers, inside the base of which there are old steam engines.
