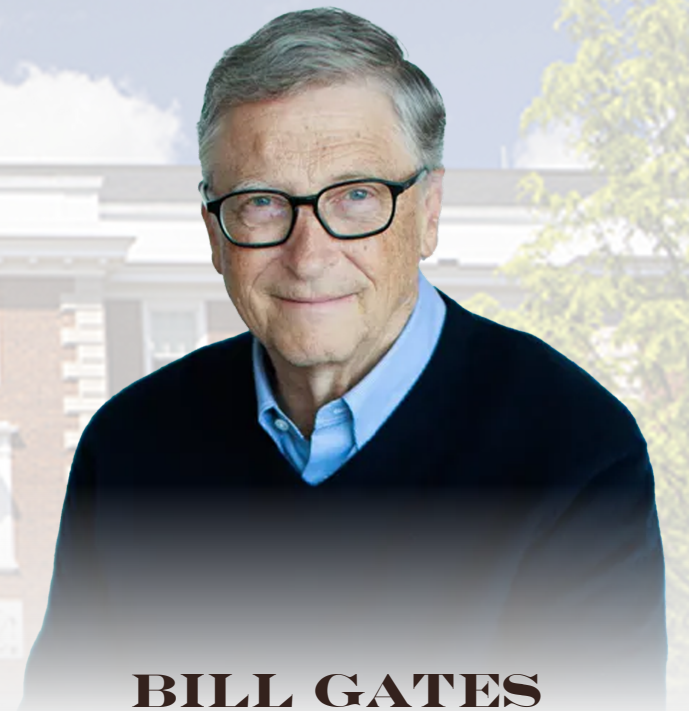
BARACK OBAMA

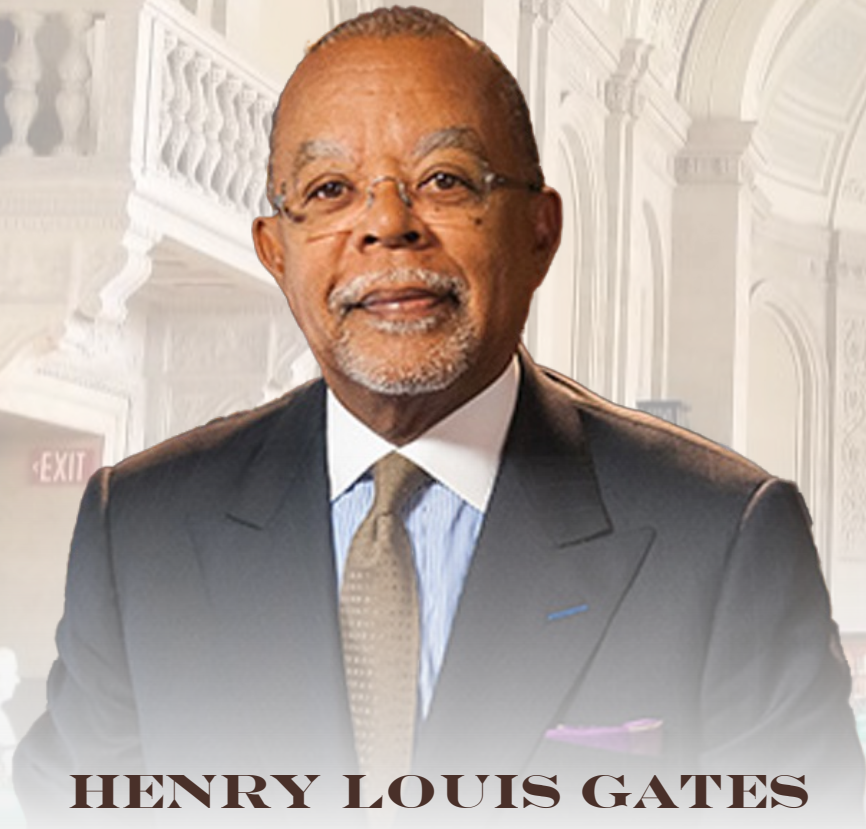


AMARTYA SEN

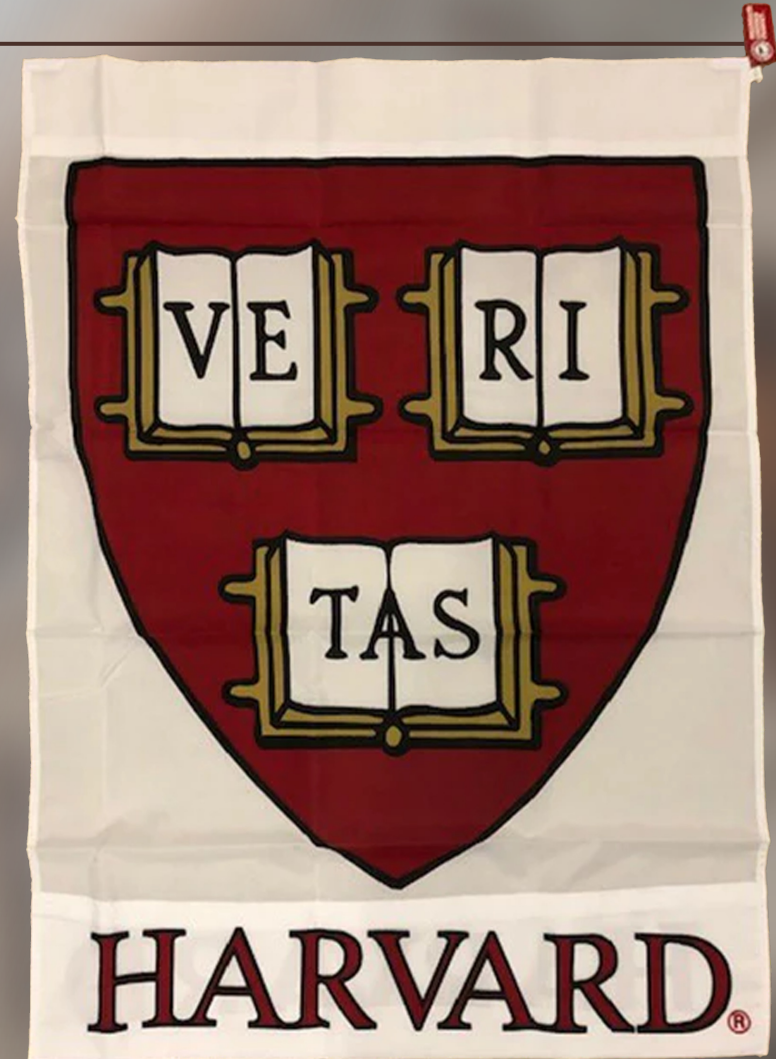
HENRY LOUIS GATES

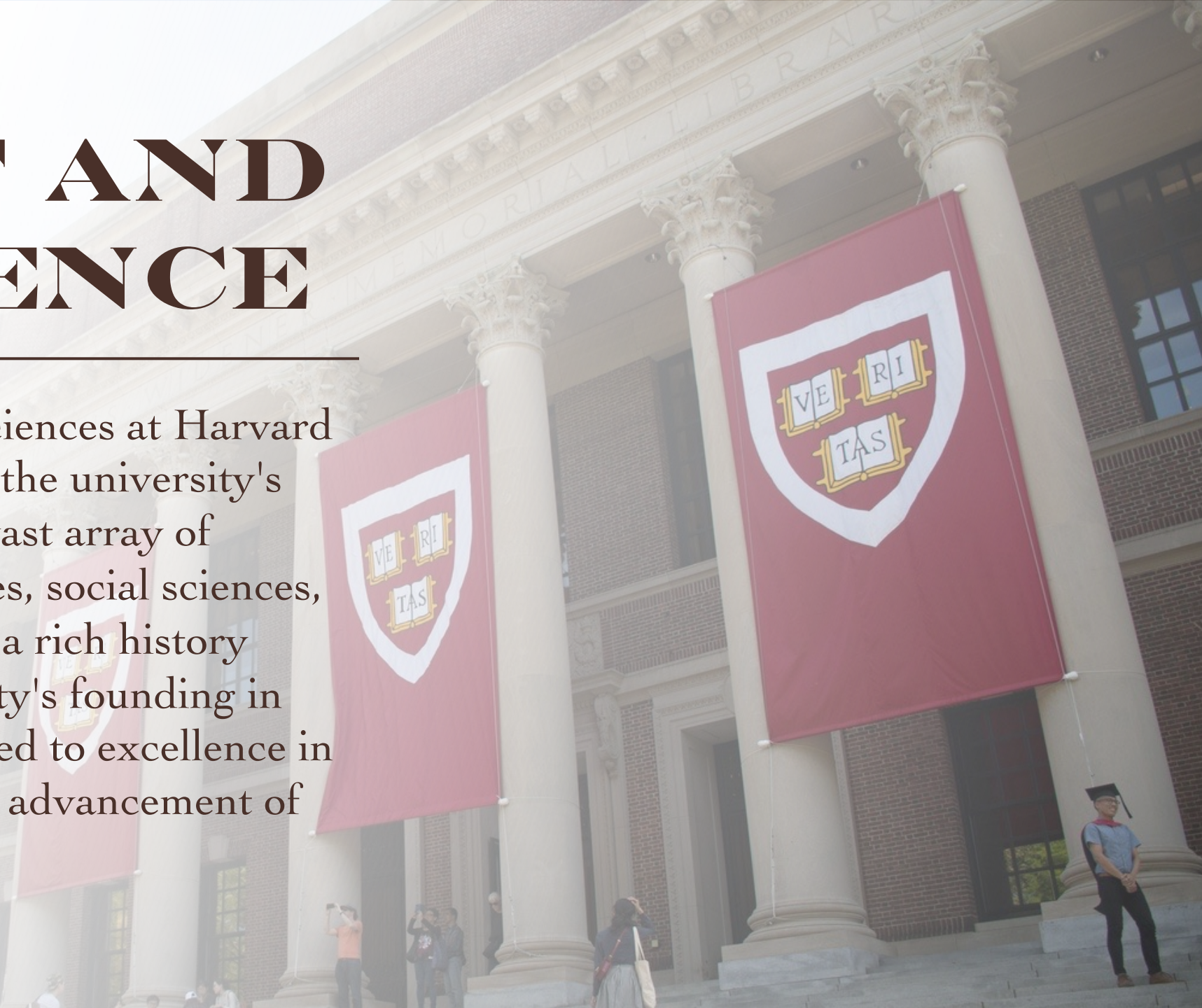

Bailyn received his Ph.D. from Harvard in 1953 and joined the faculty in 1949, where he remained for his entire academic career.

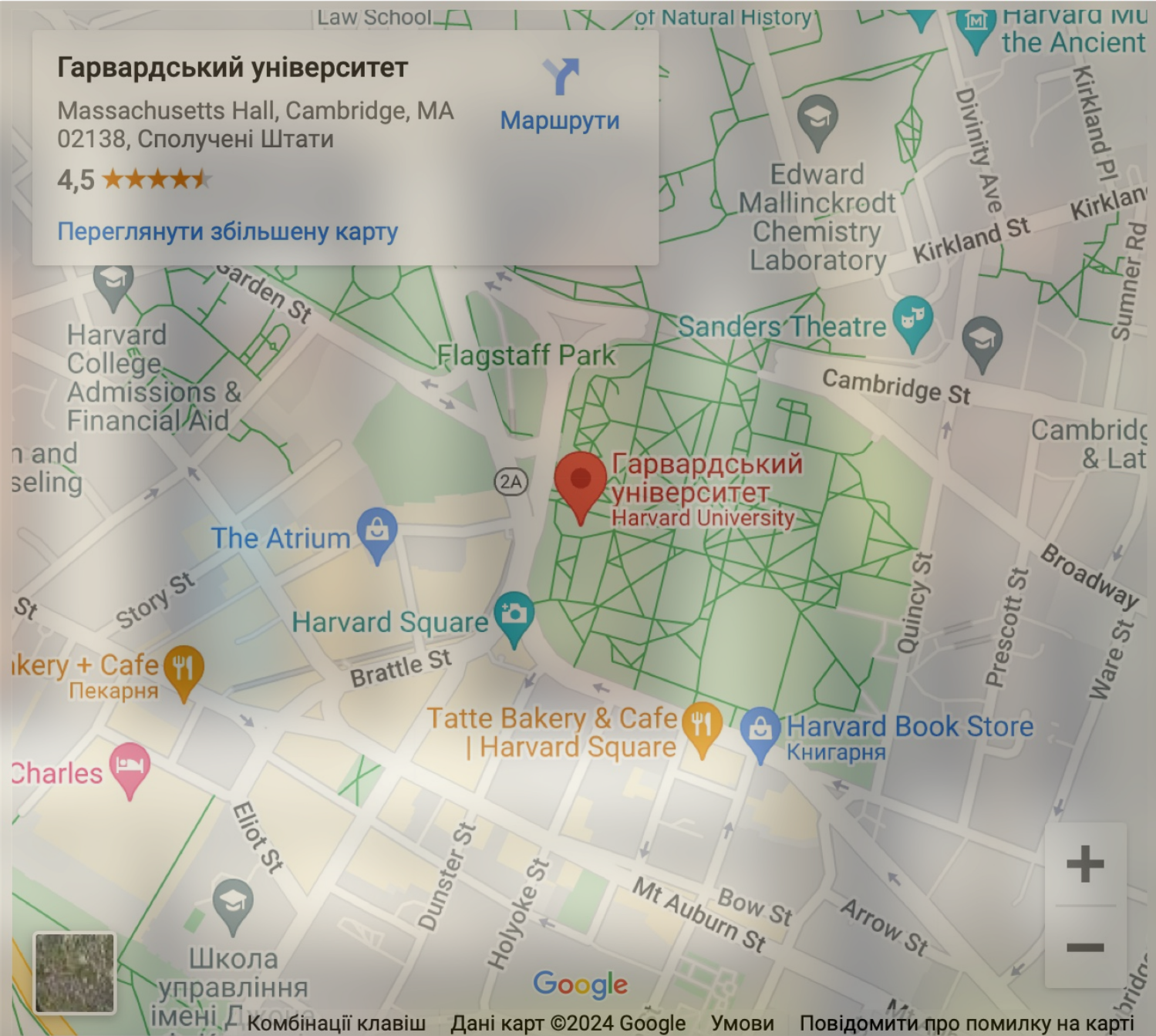
